So the first thing that I must do is say a very big thank you to Guy for all the hard work that he has put in and is continuing to do by helping me in the transition period and beyond.

Please bare with me as I try to get to grips with the role. In an effort to ease the burden of the work involved in the task, it is proposed to set up a Sailing Committee (SC) that will report to the Management Committee (MC).

There will be a few changes, some of which Guy has been planning and some that will hopefully ease the burden of the duty teams and/or race office processes.

The Winter Series was reasonably well attended and although we lost a couple of Sundays to the weather was very enjoyable with thirteen boats taking part. I'm sure that there would have been more if some of our number had not been participating in the Frozen Toe at Chichester Yacht Club.

The Mayger's Mug was raced on New Year's day with five boats taking part. Unfortunately due to the shore dump there was a little damage to some of the boats on recovery. It was nice to see one of our home bred youngsters take the win.

Blaze fleet beware!! It is rumoured that there will be two more in your number this season as well as a few carbon fibre masts appearing.

Training Matters – What's new for 2013. Roger Belton – FSC Training Principal.

Planning is well underway for the forthcoming training season with some new ideas being added to the calendar. The significant change for 2013 is that we are planning on developing Saturdays into a stronger part of the sailing experience at FSC. So the concept of "Skill Saturday" is born. These weekly afternoon events will give everyone from beginner to skilled racer an opportunity to develop their skills in a structured and supported environment and help create a bridge between Beginner courses and Sunday Racing. There will be a variety of activities from which to choose:

- Beginner improvers will have on hand skilled instruction and a safe environment to practise and develop their skills (no charge)
- Racer improvers will be offered specific Class coaching for Laser & Asymmetric dinghies led by a professional coach (like last year - charged)
- Ad-hoc coaching sessions based on demand on the day (no charge)
- Informal sailing within a defined, supervised sailing area (no charge)
- Specific coaching sessions eg sailing with spinnakers (no charge)
- Specific RYA sailing courses eg Dinghy level 1, 2 etc, Start Racing (charged)
- Specific RYA powerboat courses (practical only) leading to Level 1 & 2 (charged)
- Sailing safaris (no charge)
- Power training in the River Arun (may be charged)
- Dinghy Assistant Instructor training (subsidised & charged)
- Novice race practice (no charge)
- Novice Series racing (no charge)
- Family sailing (no charge)

This range of activity will be led by John Breach supported by the Training Team and the Duty Team. It is likely that on any given Saturday there will be several activities going on in parallel. There should be something that will appeal to a broad community of learner/improvers within the club. On some Skill Saturdays the club owned training boats will be allocated to specific courses and will not be available for general hire. On other Skill Saturdays they will be available for general hire for the afternoon and will be charged on the basis of sole private use for the period. It is possible that during the warmer summer afternoons the event will roll over into a BBQ & social (difficult to visualise this on a snowy January day!).

There are several candidates who are undertaking training to become Senior Instructors, and also Catherine Davies is doing an Advanced Instructor Course enabling her to teach Spinnakers and High Performance boats. These individual's contributions will greatly enhance our Club and enable long term sustainability.

We also plan to buy another Pico to augment the existing Club owned Training fleet of 5 Picos, an RS Feva and Bluebelle the Wanderer.

I hope you agree that we have some exciting innovations coming along for the coming year and that whether you are a top end racer practising a specific skill off the race course (eg roll tacks) or a beginner seeking to improve, there will be something for you. Looking forward to seeing you on Saturdays.
